

We've had many cloudy and rainy days these past couple weeks. The thirsty world lapped up the rain, rivers swelled, and ponds gathered in the fields. While we cheered the rain, we quickly tired of gray and dreary skies. And so today, all bright and sunny, grabs our attention. The sky is bluer. The grass is greener. The air is not heavy with humidity. The world and the day are fresh and refreshed.

Fresh and refreshed. In these final days of Easter, we continue to reflect on the power of Jesus' life after death to make life fresh and refreshed. In love, Jesus spent himself on the cross on Good Friday. Jesus spilled out his life for us and was placed in an earthen tomb. But Jesus didn't stay in that place of death. On Easter day, God made Jesus alive again. And now with our sins nailed to the cross and death defeated, life for us is fresh. Life is refreshed.

As we think about Jesus' new Easter life what often first comes to mind is the promise that like Jesus, we too will be raised to live forever in God's heavenly kingdom. And we rightly see Jesus' resurrection as a promise for the future. We will bask in the presence of God. We will be reunited with loved ones, and friends, and the faithful who have gone before us. And yet ......

And yet, there's more to Easter than that glorious future when everything is perfect. The promise of Easter is for the future, *and* the promise of Easter is for right now. Because Jesus who died is alive, life now is different. Life now is fresh. Life now is refreshed.

Every year during the weeks of Easter we read from the book of Acts which tells the experiences of the earliest Christian believers. Because Jesus is alive, everything was different for those early followers of Jesus. The new life of Jesus gave fresh understandings, fresh adventures, fresh perspectives. Recall some of the stories we have heard over these past weeks of Easter. Rather than continuing as individual households, the followers chose to be together, to live and stay together, as a community of faith. The Spirit is given early in the book of Acts, and the followers, empowered by the

Spirit, became an extension of Jesus' healing ministry by giving wholeness to a man who had been born lame. The followers who had spent some three years listening and learning from Jesus now were boldly speaking the good news of Jesus. The followers learned that God's grace included an unexpected expression of sexuality in the Ethiopian eunuch and welcomed different ethnicities. As the apostles appointed a replacement for Judas, they organized for mission. Jesus' new life changed everything. Life was fresh. Faith understandings were refreshed. The new life of resurrection unfolded in the here and now.


And isn't that where we are right now? Easter Sunday was my final time to lead worship at my previous parish, Washington Prairie. The life that I had known for more than seven years came to an end. That ending for me was also a beginning as I anticipated coming to St. Peter as an interim pastor. After 47 years, I have a good idea about how to be a pastor. Being an interim is new. Easter meant doing ministry in a different, or fresh, way.

And because of Easter, because Jesus is alive, that freshness can touch St. Peter Lutheran Church, here in Greene, IA. We know where we've been for 152 years. Where is the freshness of Easter leading us now? As I understand pastoral and congregational interim, it's a time to ponder how the new life in Jesus is stretching, how the new life in Jesus is challenging, how the new life in Jesus is nudging, how the new life in Jesus is expanding our expectations, how the new life in Jesus is blowing freshness into our whole being as a people of God here at St. Peter.

The first believers we read about in the book of Acts did things they never thought they would do. They thought things they never thought they would think. They went places they never thought they would go. They expected to be surprised and were refreshed because Jesus is alive.

The grand invitation to St. Peter is to join in the adventure of a living faith and to absorb the freshness that the Living Lord continues to give.

Christ is Risen! Indeed!
